# HEADLINE - The Village Des Sourires becomes a reality



The last few weeks have been a real turning point for one of our most symbolic projects: the "Village des Sourires" (Village of smiles) in Madagascar.

After two years of problems, twists and turns, floods, and endless administrative procedures, the project is finally entering its concrete phase. And we won't hide our excitement.

Thanks to the technical support of the partner of our local Association 2400 Sourires, the Entreprise COLAS, work on the sports center has finally begun. This facility will eventually host many sports, including climbing and, of course, badminton. But above all, it is a place designed for the children of the village, all former street children, who will be able to practice regularly, improve their skills, and dream. It will also be a space for coaching courses, international exchanges, and perhaps even... sports and solidarity trips combining badminton and field activities. And that's not all: the heart of the village is also taking shape.

Four children's houses are already ready: freshly painted, beds installed, doors fitted. The other four will follow by the end of August, ready to welcome the next children in the best possible conditions.

This project is moving forward thanks to the tenacity and incredible energy of our local partners, the association 2400 Sourires. A committed, persevering, and deeply human team to whom we owe a great deal.

It's a great collective victory... and it's only the beginning.

### **NEWS FROM OTHER PROGRAMS**

### Rwanda - Concrete progress for vulnerable children in Rilima

Following the lunch meeting organized on June 27 in Rilima by our partner YOMADO, as part of the "Rays of Hope for Orphans and Vulnerable Children" project supported by Solibad, a new step has been taken in the collaboration between local actors and the association.

The meeting, which brought together representatives from local communities, education, and health, laid the foundations for more structured work on children's rights, current protection policies, and the central role that sport, particularly badminton, can play in supporting vulnerable children.



The discussions highlighted the need to raise awareness among families, particularly around the issues of positive parenting. Several participants expressed the wish that YOMADO and Solibad could organize a larger-scale workshop to support parents in their educational and protective role.

In addition, the discussions provided an opportunity to officially announce the acquisition of a plot of land, financed by Solibad, on which a welcoming house dedicated to children participating in the program will be built. This project marks an important step toward more sustainable support, focused on creating a safe, suitable, and forward-looking space.



## Indonesia - A look at a young artist

We continue this newsletter with a beautiful image from Indonesia: Julia Ika, 13, who has Down syndrome, and her father, our head badminton coach in Yogyakarta.

Ika is part of our Solibad program in Indonesia, in which she has been involved in since she was very young. Recently, she had the opportunity to participate in a local art exhibition, marking a new milestone in her journey. Her father, who is actively involved with us on the ground, embodies the Solibad spirit: passing on knowledge, providing support, and pushing boundaries. We are delighted to be able to share this powerful and heartwarming story.

# Mayotte - Build relationships before laying the groundwork

On July 5, Arnaud Genin visited one of the slums participating in the program to meet with the families receiving support and spend some time with the children. conversations, During their several children expressed a desire to play badminton, despite the lack of suitable space. A small group then joined Arnaud to explore the surrounding area in search of a suitable location. While conditions are far from ideal, a dirt soccer field seems to offer a first possibility, still to be confirmed.



The day was also an opportunity to help the children with their homework, catch up with the families, and distribute food to some of them.

The welcome we received was particularly warm, once again demonstrating the

strength of the bonds that have been forged over time and the importance of these shared moments in the field.
